Use maps, globes and atlases to name and locate key topographical features (including hills, mountains, coasts and rivers) of the United Kingdom

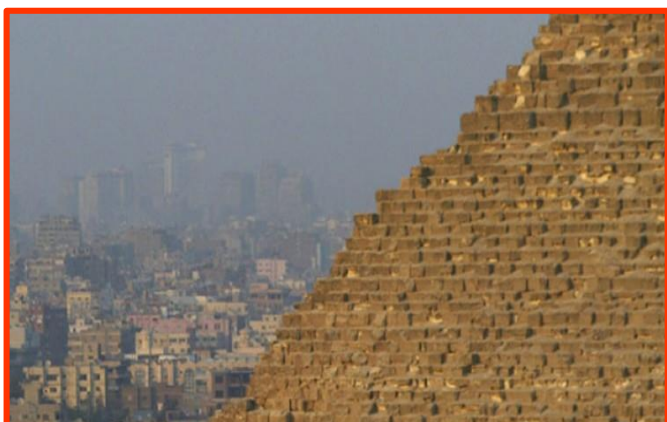
Describe and understand key aspects of human geography including types of settlement and land use

Imhotep (approximately 2650–2575 BC)

Imhotep the architect is credited with the development of a six-layer step pyramid at Saqqarah, the world's oldest stone monument, and is considered the essential first step in the development of the pyramid.
