We will learn to:

- Use grid references to name and locate counties, cities and landmarks in the United Kingdom.
- Use grid references to name and locate countries, cities, rivers and mountains in Europe
- Compare physical features of different areas using aerial photographs/satellite images
- Use maps and photographs to identify physical features of Poland and compare with that of the UK
- Compare the physical Geography of the Southern mountain region (South of Krakow) with Kent

We will practise these skills:

- Name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom
- Locate the world's countries, using maps to focus on Europe (including the location of Russia), concentrating on countries and major cities
- Understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of human and **physical** geography of a region in the UK and, a region in a European country
- Locate places on a range of maps (variety of scales)
- Identify features on an aerial photograph, digital or computer map
- Begin to use 8 points of a compass
- Use four figure grid references to identify features on a map.
