4. Make contributions that are relevant to those that have come before

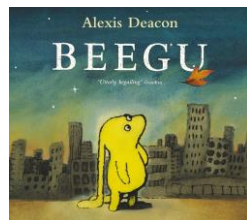
Reading:

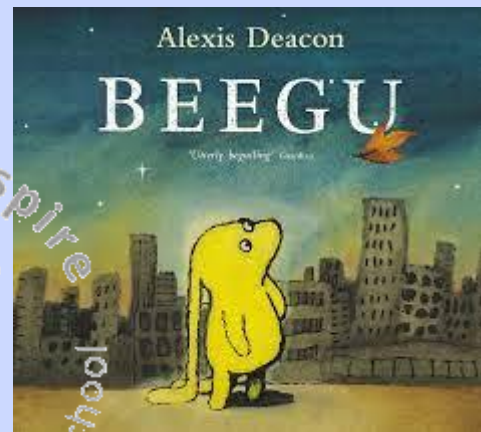
