Many important rituals and festivals take place in the home which is the most important focal point for Jewish religious life. The synagogue shows the public dimension of the faith. As well as a place of worship it is a place where the community gathers for education and social events. Many of the rituals of the synagogue are based on those of the Temple in Jerusalem which was destroyed in 70 AD and never rebuilt. Since then public religious life has centred on the synagogue.

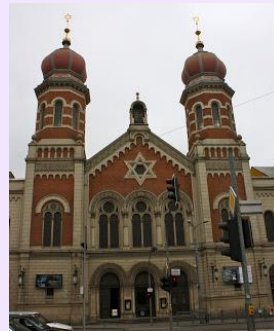
