

### Understanding of the World Activity – People and Communities

In the story of 'Zog', Princess Pearl wanted to be a doctor. Think about grown-ups you know, what jobs do they do? Do they have to dress up in special ways to do their job? When you are a grown-up, what job would you like to do? You could find clothes at home to dress up like someone who does that job. Or you might make a drawing, painting or model of something to do with that job.



### Wellbeing Activity

Zog had to **practise** to get good at the skills in the story. He showed **perseverance** by keeping trying until he mastered that skill. What skill are you trying to master at the moment? Do you need to practise getting dressed? Doing up your own buttons? Using a knife and fork? Writing numbers? Writing certain letters (remembering the formation of 'b' or 'n')? Spend some time practising something you would like to get better at.
