Grammar:

Composition:

1. Introduce the formation of cursive letters and how to join them.
2. Write words and phrases in a cursive style.

Speaking and Listening:

1. Seek clarification when a message/ teaching point is unclear.
2. Use subject specific vocabulary to explain and describe.
3. Speak confidently to a group of peers
4. Know that different language is appropriate in different situations

Reading:

1. The pupil can read accurately by blending the sounds in words that contain the common graphemes for all 40+ phonemes.
2. The pupil can read many common exception words.*
3. In a book closely matched to the GPCs as above, the pupil can read with fluency and understanding

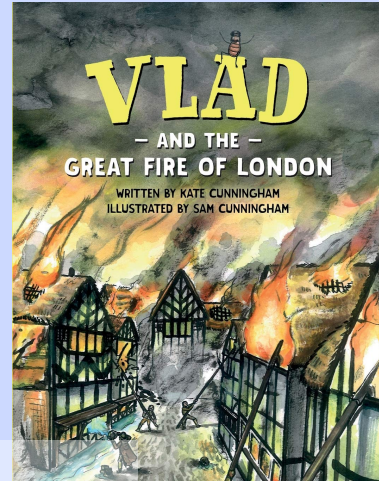
