

## Literacy

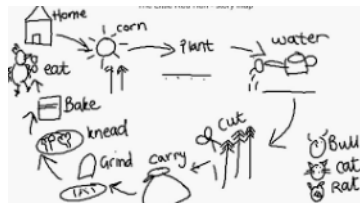


Reading the stories of 'The Little Red Hen', 'The Enormous Turnip', 'The Gingerbread Man' and 'Handa's Surprise'.

Building story maps to help with the retelling of the story.



## Food

Using the core texts of The Little Red Hen, The Gingerbread Man, The Enormous Turnip and Handa's Surprise.

## Communication and Language

Exploring different types of fruit and describing the feel, smell, touch and taste to others.



Creating a special storytelling chair for the children to retell the stories to each other.



Expressing their likes and dislikes regarding food, and giving reasons for their preferences.

Listening to instructions to follow recipes to prepare food.

## Expressive Arts and Design

Acting out the different stories with role play masks.



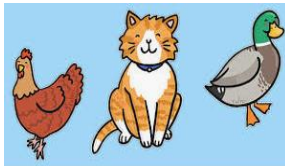
Role playing in a fruit and vegetable shop and a restaurant.

Creating observational drawings of fruit inspired by famous artists, and exploring colour mixing.



## Personal and Social Development

Discussing the choices and actions of the characters in the stories. What would the children do if they were them?



Getting into character of different characters from the stories. Children to give advice to that character on how they should behave.

## Understanding of the World

Looking at food from around the world.



Looking at where food comes from and how they are made / how they grow.



Monitoring frozen fruit in a warm classroom and describing the changes they see over time.

Making gingerbread men with the children and exploring what happens to the ingredients as they are mixed together and heated.



## Physical Development

Discussing healthy eating and looking at a balanced and healthy meal.



Creating movement to music to represent the different characters in the story.



Cutting and peeling fruit and vegetables.

Weaving different materials to create baskets for food.
