Maths– It's Me 1,2,3

This week, we are looking at different ways of showing 1,2 and 3. Ask your child to draw you a number of dots/objects/pictures. Ask them questions like- 'How many will you have if you draw one more?' What if I hide one, how many now? In class, we will also practise how to write the numbers 1,2 and 3 accurately.

Phonics

This week we will be learning the sounds u, b,f,e, You can help your child to practise these sounds by looking for things around the house or outside beginning with the sound. Spend time reviewing previous sounds learnt as well.

New videos will be uploaded to Google Classroom to demonstrate the correct letter formation.
