Maths: On the Move

This week we will be focusing on problem solving. Using the book Harry and a bucketful of dinosaur the children will figure out various problems eg. How many legs are in the bucket? You could use stories at home to look for Maths problems eg. in stories about animals, 'how many animals on this page? How many eyes have they got? Can we use doubles to figure it out?

Topic

This week we are going to learn about a famous British runner 'Dina Asher Smith'. The children will be encouraged to think of and write questions that they would like to find out about her as well as finding out about how she keeps healthy.

Relationship Education: Created to Love Others

Unit 3 of the Live Life to the full programme is about keeping safe. Through an interactive story where children have to help Freddy Teddy stay safe in various situations, children will explore different ways they can stay safe outside, inside and inside themselves too. They will also be introduced to the idea of bodily privacy (including the NSPCC PANTS message that 'privates are privates') and the importance of talking to their 'special people' if anything troubles them. All this is underpinned by the religious teaching that we are created and loved by God, with bodies and minds that He wants us to keep safe.

New morning arrangements

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, the children will now be coming in to school independently like the rest of the children in school. This is to help them prepare for starting year 1.
