Remembering previous learning

In Reception, children will have experienced:

Explore the natural world around them.

Recognise some environments that are different to the one in which they live.

Explain some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.

Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures of animals and plants. Know some similarities and differences between the natural world around them and contrasting environments, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.

Understand some important processes and changes in the natural world around them, including the seasons and changing states of matter.

What seas surround the UK? The Atlantic Ocean; the North Sea; the English Channel; The Irish Sea.

What is a rainforest? A rainforest is hot, wet, noisy and full of trees and animals.

What famous rainforest can you name? We have learnt about the Amazon Rainforest.

Where in the world are Beijing, Sydney and New York? Beijing is in China; Sydney is in Australia; New York is in North America.

In this unit children will...

- name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans
- use world maps, atlases and globes to identify countries, continents and oceans
- use simple fieldwork and observational skills.

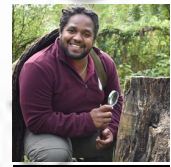

Knowing more in Y1

What is a continent? A continent is a collection of countries.

What is it like where the Antarctic penguin lives? It is very cold, with lots of snow and ice. The sea is very cold too.

What is it like where the Asian Panda lives? hot, cold, wet, dry, windy, calm and snowy. The panda likes to live in the countryside.

What is Oceania? Oceania is a continent that is made up of lots of sea area and a few islands, including New Zealand and Australia.

What is under the sea? Sea animals and fish, lots of water, the seabed, coral reefs.

Where do whale sharks migrate to? Ningaloo Reef, which is off the central west coast of Australia.

What is it like where elephants live (African rural landscape)? Deserts, sand dune mountains, grass, trees, bushes.

What is a swallow? A swallow is a small black and white bird that migrates across the world.

Why do some animals travel huge distances? Some animals travel huge distances to live where it is summer.

Which continents does a swallow pass over in its yearly migration? Europe and Africa.
