The name Passover comes from the story of the angel of death passing over the houses of the Israelites, Pesach comes from the paschal lamb which was once sacrifice when there was still a Temple in Jerusalem. It is a time when Jewish people thank God for their freedom and remember those who are enslaved today. Hospitality is important at Pesach.
