In the news this week

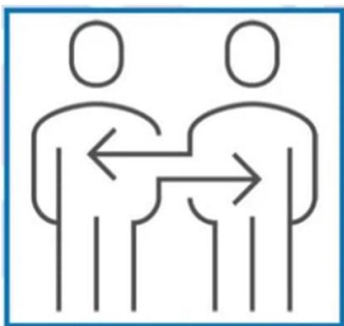

Their invention, called the Thermavault, was submitted to The Earth Prize, a global competition which aims to inspire young people to solve world-wide problems.

We respect each other.

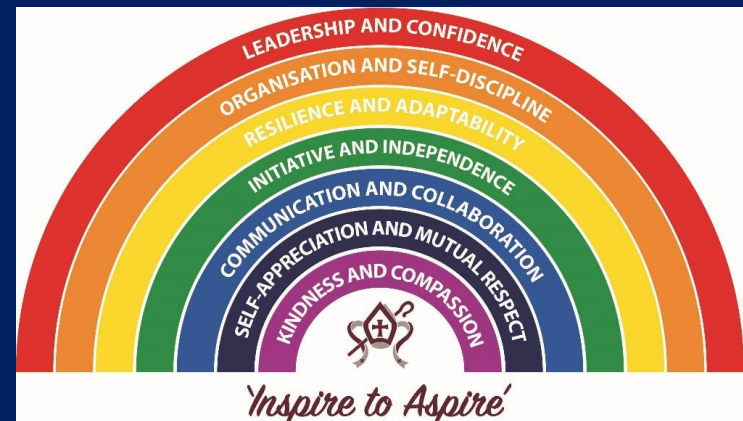
We expect others and expect them to show us respect.
