In the news this week

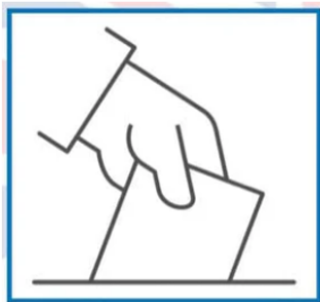

We all have a say.

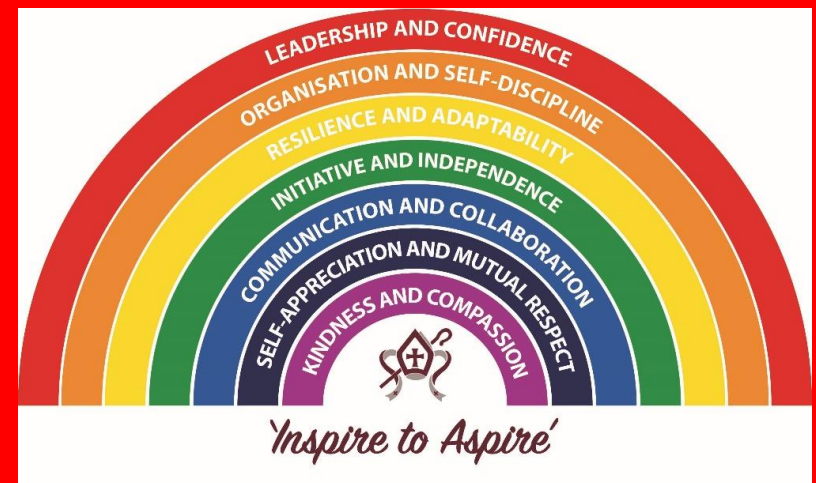
Our opinion and our vote matters.
