Writing Outcomes:

1. Argument - Cats vs. Dogs: Which Is Better?

Grammar:

1. Use a range of commands, exclamations, questions and statements in writing.
2. Use present and past tense correctly and consistently.

Composition:

1. Re-read to check that their writing makes sense and that verbs to indicate time are used correctly and consistently, including verbs in the continuous form.
2. Write down ideas and/or key words, including new vocabulary.

Speaking and Listening:

1. Understand instructions with more than one point.
2. Speak confidently to a group of peers.
3. Reflect on the clarity of what is being said.
4. Recount experiences with interesting detail.

Reading:

1. The pupil can read accurately, by blending the sounds in words that contain the common graphemes for all 40+ phonemes.
2. The pupil can read many common exception words.*
3. In a book closely matched to the GPCs as above, the pupil can sound out many unfamiliar words accurately.

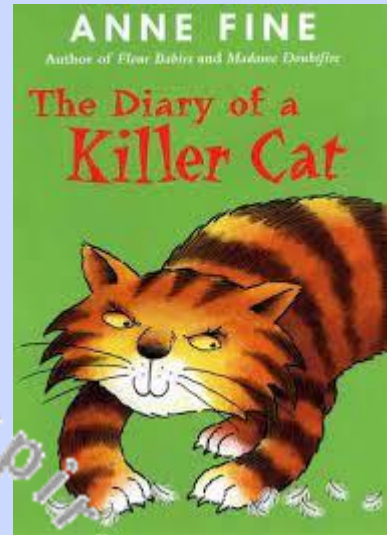
