Knowing more in Y2

What different types of weather do we have in the UK? Lightning, cloud, wind, sun, rain, snow.

How do we know what the weather will be like? People predict the weather and report what it will be like. They use maps and symbols to show what the weather will be like.

How does wind affect the weather? The wind blows from different directions, and this causes changes in weather.

What are the points of the compass? North, East, South, West

What are the 4 seasons? Spring, summer, autumn and winter.

What happens in the different seasons? Summer - hot, sometimes rains, sunny, Autumn - windy, rainy, cloudy, leaves turn brown, Winter - cold, windy, snow, rain, Spring - rainy, windy, not too cold, not too hot, new leaves, buds.

How is weather different in different parts of the UK? It is warmer and milder in the south. It is colder and more windy in the north.
