Behaviour

All children are expected to follow the Pride Values. Each class has a behaviour chart.

SUN - All children start the day on the Sun.

CLOUD – A warning that they are not behaving appropriately.

RAINDROP – Children are continuing to misbehave ... Time out - Lose some of playtime; sent to another class.

LIGHTNING – Still continue to misbehave, disruptive, fighting, physically hurting others, swearing, vandalism and other serious behaviour – Sent to Head or Deputy, parents informed.

Things to remember to bring in

Reading folder with book and Reading Record

Red Spelling Book

Letters folder

Water bottle (Sports Top)

Homework (no later than Thursday)

Classroom Routines

Toilets :

The children are encouraged to go at break times and lunch times to avoid wasted learning time. (Please make us aware if your child has a medical need to go more often)

Jumpers/ Cardigans:

The children are encouraged to put them in their tray to avoid them getting lost. They need to be **labelled**.

Water Bottles:

Children need a **sports top** water bottle (to avoid spills) in school every day. This keeps the child hydrated, more alert and ready to learn.

These will come home to be cleaned and refilled each night.

Home time:

The children are encouraged to collect all their belongings before going out to the playground and shouldn't need to go back into the building.

Children can only be collected by people that the parents have named on the collection form or if they have phoned to let us know.
