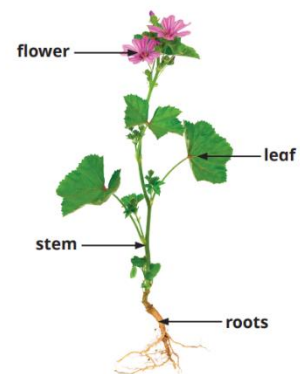

Knowing more in Y1

What is a plant? A plant is a living thing that usually grows in soil.

What are the main parts of a plant? Some plants have roots, a stem, leaves and flowers.

What is a seed? A seed can be planted to grow into a new plant.

Can seeds be planted in winter? Some seeds can be planted in winter but must be kept warm to grow.
