2. Edit and improve writing to interest the reader.

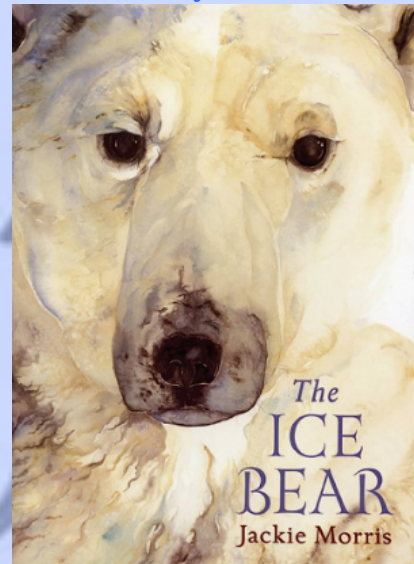
Speaking and Listening:

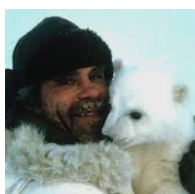
